D1. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

D1a. King City Performance Improvement Plan

Conor Boughey reported that several Ad-Hoc committee members and Michael Simmons went to King City council meetings. The meetings went well, and the City now has a better understanding of MBASIA's perspective on their ongoing issues as a result. Michael Powers

reported that Michael Simmons did an admirable job presenting to the City Council. Daniel Dawson asked about the general reaction from the City Council. Michael Simmons explained that the Council was concerned about the rule of going to a \$250,000 deductible in a situation like this. Michael Simmons explained that there is no rule, but there is a maximum that the City has to pay, but it can be revisited if the City changes practices.

Jamie Goldstein reports that the reason for the high Self-Insured Retention was to show that the Board is serious, and to protect MBASIA. There was also a need to balance how much the City can pay in order to still be able to provide services.

Daniel Dawson asked Michael Powers if he thinks this got the City Council's attention. Michael says he thinks it did.

Rene Mendez reports that there is precedent for allowing Cities to use Safety Grant Funds for audit reimbursement and that is what is happening here.

D2a1. 2014-15 Committee Assignments

Conor Boughey reported that the executive committee stands for two years, but every sub-committee is brought to the board annually. At least one change has to be made this year due to the departure of Robert Galvan.

Rene Mendez would like to start transitioning committee members to bring in new members, and transition those who have not been chairs into those positions. Rene would like Jamie Goldstein to transition into the position of Vice Chair of the MBASIA Board.

D2b1. Safety Funds Budget

Conor Boughey reported that there have been a lot of requests to use funds this year. As of the date of the Agenda printing, \$59,800 of funds were requested for use, and \$31,988.89 were reimbursed. There are several funds requests expected to be made before the end of the fiscal year. MBASIA budgets \$75,000 for safety funds yearly. The total proposed budget for safety is \$75,000 and the Board decides how much to allocate to the grant program.

Jamie Goldstein asked if there is any rules regarding using safety grant funds for doing ADA compliance work. Conor Boughey responded that the City can use its \$7,500 for ADA work.

D2d1. Proposed Liability Budget

Conor Boughey reported that the liability budget is unchanged from the April Board of Directors meeting. The actuary feels comfortable with his prior projections.

MBASIA's total budget was \$1,680,000 but is reduced to \$1,580,000 because of a \$100,000 credit from surplus. Next year, there will probably not be a credit.

D2d2. Proposed Workers Compensation Budget

Conor Boughey reported that the Workers Compensation budget is allocated separately unlike Liability budget. There are three levels of assessment, and the Level Three assessment, which is the loan, stays constant every year until the loan is paid off. Overall, there is a slight increase over last year, due to an increase in claims trends.

Jaime Goldstein asked how the percentages were ascribed on the Level Three assessment, and if it makes sense. Conor Boughey reports that it is written into the loan agreement, and it cannot be changed at this point.

Michael Simmons commented that the best thing to do is retire the loan as soon as it makes sense to do so.

D3. NEW BUSINESS

D3a. CARMA Insurance Renewal

Conor Boughey reported that at the April meeting a draft budget was presented. He reports that there will be a call to approve it as final on Wednesday, June 18, 2014. Due to a reserving error the draft budget indicated an increase of 33%, but the increase is now 25% due to correction of the error.

Michael Simmons added that there will likely be another 25% increase next year due to higher claims experience. Even though MBASIA has a higher Experience Modification Factor (ExMod), it is now paying what it should due to losing the discount from having favorable claims experience in the past.

D3b. ERMA Insurance Renewal

Conor Boughey reported that there is 9% decrease this year. The \$83,000 premium covers training, legal services and excess coverage. The premium is down this year because ERMA's ExMod went down.

D3c. CSAC-EIA Insurance Renewal

Conor Boughey explained that a year ago MBASIA was approaching a premium of \$600,000 and increasing at 25% per year. The Board wanted to reconsider their retention level. The ExMod has since lowered, and a payroll audit showed over-reporting, which resulted in a refund of over \$100,000. There is quite a large decrease this year, especially considering what the outlook originally was.

Conor also reported that this year CSAC is fully reinsured, so there is no risk of assessment from them.

D3d. APIP Insurance Renewal

Conor Boughey reported that 7 out of 10 MBASIA members participate in the APIP pool. The year over year analysis shows that MBASIA's total insured value (TIV) has gone up 1% due to new construction and a Marshall & Swift tending. The accounting rate is up 7% due to increased losses. The Administrators believe that this coverage is at a good rate, and such a low SIR is unattainable on its own.

Michael Simmons explained what is covered by Cyber Liability coverage and Pollution Coverage. He explained that if any Members were to have a Cyber Liability or Pollution claim, notifying Alliant right away is key to activating the coverage.

Michael Simmons added that thanks to Jamie Goldstein, the sublimit increased this year from \$45,000 to \$2,000,000. This is a free benefit to the program, as such, the deductible could not be changed.

Daniel Dawson asked about special terms for wave wash for city of Capitola. Conor reports that only Capitola has it, and it may be prohibitively expensive if your City has a pier.

Jamie Goldstein asked if this can be marketed outside of the Alliant. Conor responded that it can be marketed to any other insurer, but there will be coverage missing like Cyber, Pollution, and others, which are very expensive to acquire.

Rene Mendez would like to discuss this coverage further at the next Board Meeting. He is concerned about the members that don't participate in this coverage.

Linda asked about TRIA coverage. Mike says the Board usually waives this coverage.

D3g. Crime Coverage for Member Agencies

Conor Boughey explained that crime coverage is something that every City purchases on their own, not through MBASIA. Conor explained that coverage is available through the Alliant

Crime Insurance Program (ACIP). Alliant's coverage provides high limits for a relatively low premium, and protects against exposures like long-term theft. It also covers vendor and non-employee theft, which makes it unique. There is also forensic coverage, which most policies do not cover.

D3h. CSAC-EIA Member Annual Report

Conor Boughey explained the CSAC Member Annual Report and how the CSAC program works. CSAC, through independent studies, has determined that it saves members a combined total of \$92,000,000 per year. They estimate that MBASIA has saved over \$500,000 through using this program for the last four years.

D3i. MBASIA's 2014-15 Meeting Calendar

Conor Boughey reported that the proposed calendar mostly follows this year's calendar. Historically, meetings have been held at the Sand City Council Chambers, but they can be held in Salinas as well.

Rene Mendez give direction to hold meetings alternating between Sand City and Salinas, except for the Long Range Planning meeting which is held annually in Monterey.
